The Libraries' Multimedia Production Space (MPS) in the Sullivant Library, 1813 N. High St., offers Macintosh workstations with dual monitors, presentation spaces, specialized equipment including a 36 inch color plotter/printer for producing up to 36" x 48" inch posters, multimedia production software (Adobe programs, iLife, Final Cut Pro and more), as well as specialized training videos through Lynda.com.

An online system (library.osu.edu/blogs/mps) is available to reserve Sullivant classrooms (244A) and presentation spaces, multimedia workstations, and a variety of equipment. In addition, you can request training, setup, and other technical assistance.

The Learning Collaboration Studio (LCS) is a joint venture of the Libraries and the CIO Office. This reconfigurable high-tech learning environment is located in the Science and Engineering Library, 175 West 18th Avenue.

Course-Related Instruction

Classroom Presentations

Library faculty work cooperatively with course instructors to teach students how to use information resources effectively for course assignments.

Librarians will:

- Provide research instruction tailored to specific course topics and goals.
- Collaborate with instructors to develop information-rich assignments.
- Work with instructors to create course-specific resource pages in Carmen.

Online Learning Resources

“Make the Leap” Online Assignment

Instructors can request a library research skills assignment for your Survey 100 class. This assignment uses library online resources to give students hands-on experience with core tools and teach them basic academic research skills. Business, Engineering and Health Sciences versions are used for survey courses in those disciplines. Student work is automatically scored and grades (40 points) are sent to instructors electronically. An introductory presentation by a librarian can also be requested, or students can be referred to an online version of this introduction.

Learning Objects for Courses

A team of the Libraries' teaching and subject specialists will work with faculty to develop online learning resources targeted to specific course needs.



On Demand Learning Objects

The OSU Libraries also provides a variety of online tools to help, on demand, with the research process.

net.TUTOR – improve research skills with these interactive online tutorials. Instructors can assign tutorials and receive reports of student quiz scores.

Movies – demonstrate key strategies for using important research tools.

The Gateway to Information – locate quality print, online and Web resources by subject.

Head Hunt – learn about the Libraries' resources and services through interactive games, puzzles, and short films.
